Perthes disease is a challenging condition to treat, and because it is so uncommon, it is also challenging to research. By taking a multi-centered approach, we can more effectively address the many unanswered questions about Perthes. IPSG allows me the opportunity to contribute to this important research, and to collaborate with a global team of physicians dedicated to improving the quality of care for children with this disorder.

What would you say is the most challenging part of treating Perthes Disease?

Perthes disease will affect each child differently, and it is very challenging to predict how the disease will progress. This makes determining how and when to intervene much more complex than in other orthopaedic disorders.

What would you like to see accomplished through annual IPSG meetings?

Each annual meeting gives us the opportunity to evaluate our progress and determine how we can better conduct our research. I hope that with continued collaborative effort, we are able to improve our ability to effectively treat children with Perthes disease.
